

WORKING GROUP REPORT TO PARISH COUNCIL ON TRAFFIC, TRANSPORT AND STREET LIGHTING: 10 AUGUST 2026

Minute Item 40 (b)

- (i) Pedestrian safety and Cropredy Primary School. Cllr Dunn would follow up with Cllr Aramini-Brant if there is no reply before the next Parish Council (PC) meeting on 10 August 2026.
Followed-up with Cllr Aramini-Brant on 04 August 2026 which prompted him to contact Oxfordshire Highways as follows: "I raised this enquiry on the Cllr Enquiries Form on 22 April 2026 on behalf of Cropredy Parish Council to organise an on site meeting to discuss on going safety concerns by the parish council, residents and I. I cannot not see any response to this enquiry. Please see below. Could we arrange an onsite meeting in September to view and discuss road safety issues around the primary school please.
- (ii) Speed calming measures along Williamscot Road. Raised this matter again on 04 August 2026 with Cllr Aramini-Brant. No response to date on this matter.
- (iii) Part-Night Lighting. As previously agreed, a consultation will be circulated to Cropredy residents in the Autumn of 2026
- (iv) 20 mph repeater sign in Station Road. No action to date. Latest update on Fix My Street states that the matter should be referred to Highways 20MPH team at- <https://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/residents/roads-and-transport/traffic/requesting-20mph> . Highways contacted 7 August 2026.
- (v) National Speedwatch Day on 15 July 2026. Herewith a summary of the data collected on the day:
 - Two teams, one at Williamscot Road for 1.5 hours between 9.00-10.30 and one at Claydon Road for 1 hour between 15.00-16.00
 - Total number of vehicles. Williamscot Road: into village 64 and out of village 29. Claydon Road: into village 22 and out of village 29
 - Total number of violations. Williamscot Road: into village 18 and out of village 8. Claydon Road: into village 1 and out of village 6
 - Total number of violations of 40 mph and above. Williamscot Road: into village 2 and out of village 0. Claydon Road: into village 1 and out of village 0
 - Highest speed recorded for the day = 44 mph
 - Totals for the day:
 - Total hours of sessions: 2.5 hours
 - Total number of vehicles: 144
 - Total number of violations: 33
 - Total number of violations ≥ 40 mph: 3
 - Highest recorded speed: 44 mph
